Lindstrom joins the ranks of court house attorneys

There is a new face in the Preble County Prosecutor's Office these days, but her face and legal career are not new to Preble County.

Carol Perritt Lindstrom recently joined the ranks of the courthouse attorneys as chief assistant prosecuting attorney.

Lindstrom came to Preble County in October 1984, when she went to work for Rural Legal Aid.

Previous to her work with legal aid, Lindstrom gained experience in the field of domestic relations and landlord/tenant matters.

She is a 1980 graduate of Ohio

State Law School and received a bachelor's degree from Winthrop College in Rock Hill, S.C. Lindstrom and her husband, Thomas, live in Springboro.

Lindstrom said she decided to take the position because it was time for a new challenge and offered growth opportunities. She has also established a private practice in the community.

According to Preble County Prosecutor Becky Ferguson, Lindstrom will be handling much of the civil work for the various townships, villages and school districts, for which the prosecutor's office acts as legal counsel.

"She will also be doing her share of criminal cases," Ferguson noted, adding Lindstrom is a good, qualified addition to the office.

Lindstrom said she was "surprised" at the volume of civil work the prosecutor's office handles and is looking forward to working with everyone.

"I just grabbed it...I am really looking forward to the job and I hope I can do some good work for the county," Lindstrom said.

Lindstrom replaces Paul Henry, who left the office last year after being elected Eaton Municipal Court Judge.
